This month, I would like to speak about what we can do to keep ourselves safe on and off campus. As you pick up any newspaper or turn on any television, you see that criminal acts are on the rise. What we see happening in a big city can happen in a small city just as well; this is not to say it happens on the same scale or frequency. If you are aware of your surroundings and take a few simple steps, you substantially lessen the chances of becoming a target.

Be situationally aware. Know what is going on around you and pay attention to others that are close to you. When out of your car getting gas, don't leave your keys laying out. Put them in your pocket. As you pump gas, have your back against your car. This lets you see anyone approaching from either side. In large crowds, if you are carrying a purse, put it in front of you. If you have your wallet or just an ID and credit cards, put them in your front pocket. When you park your car, whether it be at home or at an event, lock the doors and place valuables out of sight. Don't leave a garage door opener visible, put it away. If you are out with friends, watch out for each other, stay together, and always walk in pairs.

When parking on campus, lock your car doors and keep valuables out of sight. In the residence halls, don't let someone piggyback on your card swipe when entering your hall and don't prop doors open. As you walk around on campus, look where you are going. Walking around looking at your cell phone does not allow you to see who is around you or a car that may be coming down the road.

These are all simple steps that each of us can take to make ourselves safer as we enjoy our campus and community.
